1. Point Evaluation System

A point evaluation system assigns a weight in percentage points based on importance instead of a monetary value to a decision. Then each proposed information system is evaluated in terms of the points and given a score that might range from 0 to 100, where 0 means the alternative does not address the feature at all and 100 means the alternative addresses that feature perfectly. The scores are totaled and the system with the greatest total score is selected. Use Microsoft Excel or similar to evaluate a Point evaluation system to determine which car you should purchase. You can add factors that will assist you in your decision to column 1.
